Recently, our representatives met to discuss the above-captioned case at the Interpretive Step of the grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether assigning a casual employee to work in a different installation on a temporary basis violates Article 7.1.B of the National Agreement.

After reviewing the matter, we agree to close this grievance in accordance with the following:

Pursuant to the September 11, 2007, Memorandum of Understanding, *Re: Article 7.1*, "no city letter carrier casuals will be on the rolls later than December 9, 2007." Accordingly, the issue of this case is moot.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment that this case has been resolved.
